

Patsy DiVecchio, 91, of Aliquippa passed away peacefully on Thursday, April 9, 2009 in his home.

He was born Pasquale diVecchia on September 6, 1917 in Sant'Eufemia a Maiella, Italy, the son of the late Camillo and from 6-8pm in the ANTHONY DiVecchio and Lucia DiGiovine.

Patsy immigrated to the US in 1930, moving to West Aliquippa where he worked as a pipefitter for Jones and Laughlin Steel until his retirement in 1989. His work at J&L was interrupted by duty during the Second World War where he served in Europe with the 10th Armored Division.

He was an avid bowler and gardener and for a short time was a student at the Pittsburgh Art Institute. He continued to work after his retirement at the Howard Johnson Motor Lodge.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his wife of 59 years, Betty Frazzini, by two brothers, Michelangelo diVecchia and Anthony DiVecchio, two sisters, Eufemia Pantalone and Annina Politano and brother-in-law Paul Frazzini.
